





- The data is theoretically the same as I<sub>D</sub> and I<sub>DM</sub>, in real applications, should be limited by total power dissipation.




**Fig.1 Typical Output Characteristics**




**Fig.2 On-Resistance vs. Gate-Source**




**Fig.3 Forward Characteristics Of Reverse**




**Fig.4 Gate-Charge Characteristics**




**Fig.5 Normalized  $V_{GS(th)}$  vs.  $T_J$**




**Fig.6 Normalized  $R_{DS(on)}$  vs.  $T_J$**




**Fig.7 Capacitance**




**Fig.8 Safe Operating Area**
